

The nose is the closest feature of the face when you are looking at it head-on. Understanding how to construct it will give you more confidence when doing portraits.

Spend a few hours learning or re-learning key aspects and methods of understanding how to construct a head and its features. Once you have grasped these ideas, you will enjoy finding these relationships and looking for shapes. Nomi will be our live model. You will also receive numerous handouts.

If you have made some drawings that lack convincing noses, please bring a few of them to practice on—but not required.

Anita Lovitt is a respected teacher of watercolor and drawing. She learned artistic anatomy at the Art Students' League in New York City, under the tutelage of the revered lecturer Robert Beverly Hale.



Ask the WATERCOLOR DOCTOR

QUESTION:

Are there any myths about watercolor painting which you want to correct?

ANSWER:


Yes there are! I think that no medium encourages more myths and misunderstandings than watercolor. One of the most destructive myths is one perpetuated by gallery owners who don't want to carry watercolors, which won't bring them enough of a profit, and which they therefore continue to denigrate. (That's another story, which I'll talk about in another column!) Their frequently used myth about watercolors, as compared with any other medium, is that they are fugitive, while the pigments in oils for example are permanent. Well, they are the same pigments! Only the binders are different. If an artist is serious and careful about her pigments, she will use only non-fugitive ones. The Metropolitan Museum in NYC had a show some years ago about some of Van Gogh's paintings, in which he had knowingly used a fugitive red, which of course faded! The show displayed two versions of some of his paintings, clearly showing that even in an oil painting, fugitive pigments can fade. And we know the same to be true about acrylics, although some people mistakenly think that a glaze or varnish will seal in the color.

A second myth involves the painting process, and it says that once you put down a color, you can't change it. We know that certain papers definitely allow you to lift pigments, and many, such as Arches cold press or rough, will let you scrub or sponge off a reasonable amount of color, especially if you don't use staining colors. You can even take out an old painting and remove color from it, enabling you to make changes on it. I've done this many times, and have reworked a number of old pieces.

Another myth is one I have heard at numerous demos. As the artist begins painting, he or she will say something like, "Oh, I'm having so much fun just splashing around, not even thinking!" You can be pretty sure that any experienced painter giving a demo before a group is always thinking! But it seems more impressive and amazing not to admit to doing so! It's true that at certain points in painting we try to let go and let intuition take over. But in order to turn out a decent work, the artist must always be evaluating and making modifications to correct possible mistakes, and this is not usually "so much fun." It requires skill and knowledge based on experience and a lot of hard thinking. In addition, many if not most paintings go through stages of "not working at all," where the painter must struggle to figure out how to resolve them. Almost every one of my works goes through this stage at some point, where I wonder if I'll ever pull them off.

So if you are having self-doubts because your paintings don't just magically emerge, beautifully successful, take heart. That's simply a myth!
