<u>Eligibility</u>: Artists may enter 1 <u>watercolor painting</u>. Minimum size, framed or on canvas is 16 x 20. Maximum size, framed or on canvas is 30 wide x 40 high.

<u>Entry Rules:</u> Enter the exhibit through our website <u>www.palmbeachwatercolorsociety.com</u>, click on "shows" and pay with your credit card. You will then need to email your jpegs to Lee Krull at <u>idesign@gate.net</u>. Please include your name in the email and the title of the painting above each jpeg. Please send the ACTUAL Jpeg file, NOT an archived file from another source. If possible, please save your jpegs with your name and the name of the painting in the jpeg file name.

Do not show any frame or mat in the image and ensure the image is correctly oriented, either horizontally or vertically. Paintings that are not correctly oriented and/or cropped will <u>NOT</u> be accepted in the show. **Entries will be accepted thru January 25.**

<u>Eligible Artwork:</u> This is a Watercolor only show. No acrylics or water based Inks may be entered into this show.

Watercolor collage made by an artist's own artwork is acceptable but newspaper, magazine or other non-watermedia cutouts will <u>NOT</u> be accepted. Heavy graphite, oil pastels, foils, buttons, string are also <u>NOT</u> accepted. White tissue paper, rice paper, handmade paper and washi that has been painted over with watercolor and by the artist is acceptable.

Oils, pastels, charcoal, drawings, photography, prints or giclees will be <u>NOT</u> be accepted. Images should be of your original art only, and not created under instruction or copied from another artist's work. Only your own, original photographs may be used for reference. Paintings that have been exhibited in prior PBWS shows are <u>NOT</u> eligible.

<u>Framing Requirements</u>: Paintings on paper must be glazed with plexiglass or varnished. Glass will not be accepted. All work must be wired firmly, taped and ready to hang. All entries must remain hanging for the duration of the show.

Please include the following information on the back of your painting:

Artist Name, Address, Phone, Email, Title of Painting, Media, Size and Price.

Juror: We are pleased to announce that Jeff Weiner will be judging our show.

<u>Waiver of Liability</u>: By submitting artwork into the exhibit, you agree to abide by all rules and regulations in this prospectus of the Palm Beach Watercolor Society. PBWS reserves the right to use artwork for publicity and promotion. PBWS is entitled to a 10% donation on the sale of any artwork during the exhibit.

"As a watercolorist, I long to embrace all the wonderful things this medium has to offer, blossoms, drips, unexpected things that happen - lost edges, movement of pigment. I want to keep them all to remember that it is very much like life itself. Most artists feel that this medium is difficult to control and the most challenging to paint with. But I feel the total opposite of this. I long for all the uniqueness and beauty watercolors have to offer and to leave room for the viewer to fill in what may be missing or merely suggested.

As a teacher I love to share this passion of watercolor techniques, theories and joy with all my students. It is my hope that they will find enjoyment in interpreting their world with paint, splatters, drips and color by embracing the unexpected and unplanned."

Jan Guarino will also be holding a 2 Day Workshop "Fearless Watercolors" In Person and Virtually in January. See page 7 for details.

REMINDER: We have video recordings of monthly meeting demos and workshops. If you are a member, there is no fee for the monthly meeting demo recordings. The fee for guests is \$25 for one meeting demo recording.

If you attended a workshop and the workshop was recorded by PBWS with permission from the artist ~ and you would like a copy of the video recording the fee is \$15 for 1 day, \$30 for 2 days, and \$45 for 3 days. If you did not attend the workshop the fee for the video recording is \$75 for 1 day, \$150 for 2 days, and \$225 for 3 days. The monies will go towards our scholarship fund.

The pieces that I felt met those criteria the most are as follows:



Member Exhibit 2023

I want to thank the Palm Beach Watercolor Society for inviting me to judge the member exhibit. I found that the work represented the high level of technical proficiency of the guild members, and a well-rounded variety of subject matter and styles. To differentiate among such an array of proficient work, I view the art through set of criteria to determine which works I feel best exemplify the medium, subject and compositional qualities.

After viewing the entire exhibit, I go through a second time and take note of pieces that stood out, either for a compelling subject, an interesting composition, or an innovative use of the medium. I use a numeric score to weigh the pieces, based on *Composition, Original Concept, Technical Skill, Innovative use of Media, and Compelling Theme or Subject*. Basically, I'm looking for work that goes beyond precise reproduction and technical skill; that shows some risk-taking or pushing boundaries.

1st: Thomas Rebek; *Uncorking the Wine*: the subject shows a very complex composition that had a strong focal point, yet balanced with several interesting areas. The use of the watercolor showed a wide range of techniques employed to convey the various textures and surfaces of the objects illustrated. The figure looking away from the viewer, and the flash of light behind the bar created an interesting narrative beyond a static pose.

<u>2nd: Lee Krull; Variegated:</u> The clustering of the dense foliage as the overall composition was a welcome change from a traditional still life or manicured garden scene. Each leaf was a unique opportunity to use a variety of watercolor techniques to keep the repetition interesting. The similarities kept the composition unified, yet slight variations keep your eye moving from one leaf to another, discovering that there are actually several different types of plants represented in this painting.

<u>3rd</u>: <u>Lynn Holland</u>; <u>Coconut Garden</u>: Limiting the palette to the complimentary colors of yellow-orange and blue creates a unified composition, yet gives the painting a vibrant contrast. The graphic style of this piece is eye catching, and uncommon in watercolor painting. The subtle layering of washes to create shadows shows a strong command of the medium.

HM: Sally Accetta; Strange Feelings: this painting demonstrates a unique approach to abstract painting, alternating between the well-defined focal point and the loosely painted areas of the composition. The layering of different techniques creates a sense of realistic depth that is often overlooked in abstract work. The range of techniques used in this painting shows a command of the medium that keeps the work interesting and vibrant.

HM: Camille Rosano; The Charmer:
Initially drawn in by the eyes of the subject, I found so much more to observe when I looked more closely. The skillful layering of washes was used to "sculpt" the face, giving it depth, and adding to the sentiment portrayed in the eyes. The cool colors used to create shadows as well as the texture of the hair both demonstrate a confident use of the medium. The blue background serves as a subtle balance for the boldness of the blue eyes that dominate the composition.

JR: Pauline Runkle; Holidays in NYC:

The non-traditional use of the paint was an effective way to create a mood and a narrative in this painting. The contrast of light and dark values was very well done, emphasizing the silhouetted figure and the reflection of light on the wet ground. Though quite different, the scene reminded me of Hopper's Nighthawks.

Ask the WATERCOLOR DOCTOR

QUESTION:

I'm about to take a workshop. How do I maximize this exciting, though expensive experience?

ANSWER:


Good for you! Workshops are certainly good ways to learn new techniques and expose yourself to new ideas and processes. Before you sign up for a workshop, do a little research to see if you are interested in the instructor's work. Then find out if he or she is a good teacher. This is very important too.

Workshops usually send out supply lists in advance, so be sure to sign up early enough to get any supplies you might need. Read the list and instructions carefully, and try to follow them. If you have any questions, try to contact the instructor for further clarification.

The first day of the workshop, be sure to arrive early, to pick out your spot and set yourself up before it begins. If you are late, you can miss demos or discussions which are an important part of the learning process. When students are late, the instructor is faced with either starting with a partial class or starting late, depriving prompt students of a full day. It's a difficult decision.

Here are some additional pieces of advice to consider: You may want to take notes so that you can remember what you have learned, and refer to them later on. It's also a good idea to limit the number of workshops you take each year so that you don't become a "workshop junkie." After the workshop ends, plan to have a few weeks or more to practice the techniques you have just learned, and to try to incorporate them into your own painting style if you think they can work for you. If you don't allow for this, the chances of retaining anything from the workshop are slim. Remember though, that although a workshop is an experience for learning something new, it can also be frustrating. Be kind to yourself and don't hope to turn out a beautiful painting at this time! Don't put this pressure on yourself. Instead, you should hope to come away inspired and broadened in your approach to painting!
